They support professionals in understanding the full resettlement process, from initial planning to post-arrival support, in line with EU and international standards.

Resettlement is a key tool within international protection, providing safe and legal pathways for persons in need of protection and contributing to global responsibility-sharing.

Who this training is for

These modules are intended for:

- resettlement and humanitarian admission officers
- professionals involved in the planning, coordination, and implementation of resettlement programmes
- practitioners supporting selection, transfer, and post-arrival processes

What these modules cover

Through resettlement modules, participants develop knowledge and skills related to:

- the principles and objectives of resettlement and humanitarian admission

- **understanding complementary pathways to resettlement**
- **managing the different phases of the resettlement and humanitarian admission process**
- **applying relevant legal and policy frameworks**
- **coordinating with stakeholders involved in resettlement and humanitarian admission activities**

These competencies support the effective implementation of resettlement and humanitarian admission programmes in a structured, coordinated, and rights-based manner.

These modules provide a comprehensive, phase-based learning pathway, guiding learners through the full resettlement and humanitarian admission process from initial understanding to operational implementation.

In addition, the following non-accredited training is available:

- **Monitoring and evaluation of resettlement and humanitarian admission programmes**

This training focuses on developing competencies related to assessing the effectiveness and impact of resettlement programmes, including the use of monitoring frameworks and evaluation tools.

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
