



7.2.4. Food security

Local communities' vulnerability to climate hazards has been evident in Sindh province in recent years. Droughts and water scarcity have contributed to reduced agricultural output and rising food prices.^{[2119](#)} ACAPS identified drought as a 'critical driver' of food insecurity in Sindh in 2025. In addition, severe flooding in southern Pakistan between late 2024 and early 2025 resulted in the damage of crops in Sindh, which led to further food insecurity in the region.^{[2120](#)} The Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) reported in its 2024-25 Household Integrated Economic Survey (HIES) that 29.42 % of households in Sindh were affected by 'moderate or severe' food insecurity, including 6.3 % experiencing severe food insecurity.^{[2121](#)}

According to the Alert for Price Spikes (ALPS) ^{[2122](#)} price measuring system, *moong* lentils^{[2123](#)} and sugar were classified as 'stressed' commodities in Karachi as of February 2026. Rice (coarse and broken Basmati), wheat and wheat flour were classified as 'alerted'. For instance, the price for wheat was 105 Pakistani rupees [approximately EUR 0.3] per kilogram and for coarse rice 171 Pakistani rupees [approximately EUR 0.5], while the average wage for non-qualified was 1478 Pakistani rupees [approximately EUR 4.5] per day.^{[2124](#)} In January 2026, the news portal Minute Mirror reported about an intensifying 'wheat and flour price crisis' in Karachi.^{[2125](#)}
