



7.3.9. Mobility and internal travel

Lahore is home to Pakistan’s second largest civil airport, Allama Iqbal International Airport (IATA: LHE), located around 15 kilometres from the city centre. The airport has three terminals²²⁷⁹ and handles both domestic and international flights.²²⁸⁰

The flight-tracking website FlightRadar24 listed the following flight connections for LHE for the period 25 February 2026 to 4 March 2026:

Ongoing conflicts in the Middle East have led to 'widespread disruption' of Pakistan’s air travel, due to flight cancellations.²²⁸³

In addition to the airport, Lahore’s transportation infrastructure includes railway²²⁸⁴ and road connections to Islamabad, Karachi²²⁸⁵ as well as cities within Punjab.²²⁸⁶ Reportedly, only 31 % of urban Lahore’s population have decent access to local public transport.²²⁸⁷
